SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading – <u>Isaiah 60:1-6</u>: Jerusalem, arise! Your light and the Lord's glory shine upon you, attracting nations and kings. Joyfully, your sons and daughters return, bringing wealth and praise to the Lord.

Responsorial Psalm – <u>Psalm 72</u>: God's wisdom and justice in the king will usher in an era of fairness, peace, and expansive dominion, earning tributes from afar and devotion from all nations.

Second Reading – Ephesians 3:2-3A, 5-6: God's grace entrusted to me reveals a mystery: Gentiles are fellow heirs with Jews, part of one body, sharing the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel.

Gospel – Matthew 2:1-12: Magi from the east, guided by a star, sought the newborn King of the Jews in Jerusalem, unsettling King Herod and the city. Informed by religious leaders about the prophesied birth in Bethlehem, Herod deceitfully instructed the magi to report back after finding the child. Following the star, the magi reached Jesus, worshiping Him and offering gifts. They returned home by another way, divinely warned to avoid Herod.

Weekly Update from the Pastor

The Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord

As we celebrate the Epiphany of the Lord, the words of Pope Francis last year on this feast afford us an opportunity for deeper understanding. When reflecting on the manifestation or showing forth of God's power, Francis stated, "Faith is a journey inspired by restless questioning, fraught with risk, powered by perseverance in prayer and charity, and culminating in the awe, wonder and worship of the Lord." He goes further to challenge us to "worship God, not ourselves; let us worship God, and not the false idols that seduce by the allure of prestige and power, with the fascination of fake news; let us love God and not bow down before passing things and evil thoughts, seductive yet hollow and empty."

Pope Francis states in the homily for Mass celebrating the Epiphany that "today's faithful are called, like the Magi from the East, to set out on a journey to discover the Christ child, and further reminds us that "the first "place" where Jesus loves to be sought is in restless questioning" and further, (that) " Faith is a gift from God whose grace helps us to shake off our apathy and opens our minds to ask the important questions in life."

Our Holy Father continues that the second place to encounter the Lord is "in the risk of journeying and seeking the face of God and the beauty of his word." Reminding us of the importance of daily prayer, he states, "without a continuous journey in constant dialogue with the Lord, without attentive listening to his word, without perseverance, faith cannot grow." Pope Francis said the faithful must ask: "Jesus, who are you for me? Where are you calling me to go, and what are you asking of my life? What decisions are you asking me to make for the sake of others?

Finally, he noted that the third place to encounter the Lord is in the wonder of worship. Ultimately, he reminds us at the beginning of another year that "the purpose of everything is not to achieve a personal goal or to receive glory for ourselves but to encounter God." May this year be rich in opportunities that deepen our faith, hope, and charity.



- Parish Registration is required in preparing letters of reference and for the completion of Sponsor Forms for those seeking to serve as Godparents for Baptism or Confirmation.
- Registration and weekly support through online giving or weekly envelopes is helpful to us in budgeting for the year.
- · Registered parishioners who are donors are provided yearly statements of donations for tax purposes.


SACRAMENT of BAPTISM
