SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading - <u>Leviticus 13:1-2, 44-46</u>: The Lord directed Moses and Aaron on handling potential leprosy, requiring priestly examination and, if confirmed, declaring the person unclean. Afflicted individuals had to signify their condition by their appearance, vocalize their unclean status, and live in isolation, highlighting the seriousness with which leprosy was treated.

Responsorial Psalm - <u>Psalm 32</u>: In confessing my sins, the Lord forgave me, turning my distress into the joy of salvation. Let the righteous find joy and refuge in Him, celebrating His mercy.

Second Reading - 1 Corinthians 10:31-11:1: In everything, even in eating and drinking, aim to honor God. Avoid causing offense, seeking the good of many for salvation. Follow my example, as I follow Christ's.

Gospel - <u>Mark 1:40-45</u>: A leper's plea for healing was met with Jesus' compassionate touch and affirmation, leading to immediate cleansing. Despite Jesus' directive for discretion and adherence to Mosaic law for verification, the healed man publicized his miracle, complicating Jesus' public ministry and drawing even larger crowds to seek him in solitude.

Weekly Update from the Pastor

Lent 2024

Lent begins this Wednesday with **Ash Wednesday**, February 14. Please take some time in prayer to consider how we may use this holy season to prepare for our highest holy days, Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday. The traditional works of prayer, fasting and works of charity can help us all to share more deeply in the Paschal Mystery of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection for our salvation.

Some more Updates

Before we begin the holy season of Lent, permit me the opportunity to provide some updates on the various things that fill my day, and the last two years, in addition to important pastoral work.

- NYPD Detectives have indicated that although the case surrounding the theft of the Tabernacle is still an open case, they have yet to apprehend those responsible. Other agencies continue to assist.
- * The various insurance companies that provided insurance for replacement of stolen objects and the repair of damages are still seeking information more in line with the true value of the priceless objects that were stolen.
- ❖ The report of the insurance value of items that still grace Saint Augustine ~ Saint Francis Xavier, to provide protection from any future damage/theft, is still forthcoming. The lack of this concrete information in parish records has made the proper and fair insurance settlement difficult, if not impossible, to determine.
- ❖ The work at the parish office of Saint Augustine ~ Saint Francis Xavier has moved full speed ahead, however the vast scope of the work being undertaken still means many more days of construction before the buildings will return to use.
- Roof work on the Parish Office to Church walkway at Saint Francis is about to begin, and work on the side roofs near the Sanctuary of Church which previously leaked enough to damage the column on the right side of the Sanctuary is in process, as it was never repaired.
- Work on the exterior doors and downspouts at Saint Augustine Church are awaiting better weather—again, all long-neglected repairs that now involve a much greater cost to repair and preserve for safety and continued use.
- ❖ We still await direction regarding some issues with Safe Environment compliance for Saint Augustine∼Saint Francis Xavier to ensure the greater safety of children and vulnerable adults.
- ❖ We are growing closer to the merger of Saint Augustine ∼ Saint Francis Xavier as we move closer to preserving the future of two vibrant historic church communities in Park Slope.

While a great many things have been going on for the last two years, I am confident that we are growing near to a time where formation in and living our faith, and Pastoral Care will be a more visible priority than at present. With God's help, all these sacrifices and those we make during Lent will help bear even greater fruit.

Lenten Regulations

The penitential and grace-filled Lenten Season is a hope-filled renewal as the Church journeys towards Easter. In order to assist us, Bishop Brennan wishes to draw attention to the following:

- Abstinence: All the faithful who have reached 14 years of age are required to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent as a sacrifice.
- Fasting: All the faithful between 18 & 59 inclusive are bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and on Good Friday. Fasting means limiting oneself to one full meal and avoiding food between meals. Light sustenance may be taken on two other occasions during the day. Coffee, tea and juice are permitted at any time.
- Easter Duty: After being fully initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, all the faithful are bound to receive Holy Communion once a year. This precept must be fulfilled in the Easter Season unless, for good reason it is fulfilled at another time.




