Those not able to receive Holy Communion are most welcome to pray with us. Those unable to receive should remain in their place in prayer. Catholic Christians who are able to receive should make a bow in reverence before receiving and answer the ministers’ invitation of “The Body of Christ” with the clear answer “Amen”. Our clear response of AMEN indicates that we say yes to Jesus in the Eucharist, and to God’s plan for our salvation.  
For those unable to receive, including children who have not made their first Communion, at the end of Mass, at the final blessing, a blessing is imparted to all present in hopes that the unity of Jesus Christ will be realized.

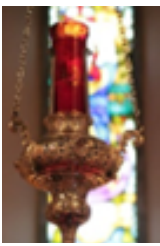

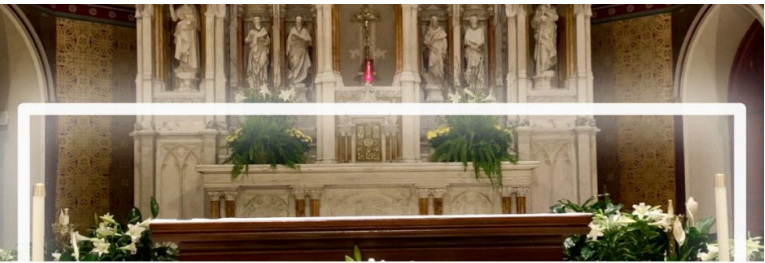
Easter Mass Remembrance & Easter Flower Donations

Offering Precious Blood at Mass

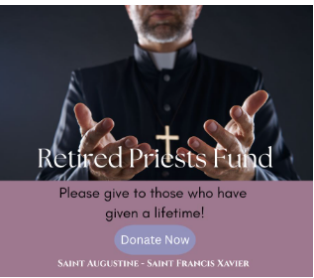
