Those not able to receive Holy Communion are most welcome to pray with us. Those unable to receive should remain in their place in prayer. Catholic Christians who are able to receive should make a bow in reverence before receiving and answer the ministers’ invitation of “The Body of Christ” with the clear answer “Amen”. Our clear response of AMEN indicates that we say yes to Jesus in the Eucharist, and to God’s plan for our salvation.
For those unable to receive, including children who have not made their first Communion, at the end of Mass, at the final blessing, a blessing is imparted to all present in hopes that the unity of Jesus Christ will be realized.

Our Easter Joy Continues....

As you know, the Easter season encourages us to be those who give vibrant witness to Jesus’ life, death and resurrection. Our witness is meant to bring others to the faith that we profess in word and deed.
Over the next few weeks, our growing faith community will continue to celebrate the joy of Easter with **15 children receiving First Holy Communion** on the weekend of May 17th. May the excitement of this day never dim as they live vibrant lives connected to Jesus in the Eucharist. In the weeks following, children will be asked to join us at Mass in their communion best so that we may all celebrate Jesus in Word and Sacrament while encouraging them, and their families, to pray with us every weekend.
As we pray at Mass on **Pentecost Sunday**, the Sacrament of Confirmation will be conferred on 4 people who will be completing their initiation as Catholic Christians. The week following Pentecost, 4 children will be receiving the Sacrament of Baptism following the noon Mass at Saint Augustine.
This past weekend, Sarah and Emanuel celebrated the **Sacrament of Marriage** at Saint Augustine. On May 15th Joselle and Michael, and on May 30th Gabrielle and David, will also celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage at Saint Francis Xavier.

What Is Happiness | Episode 1 | Philo and Sophie



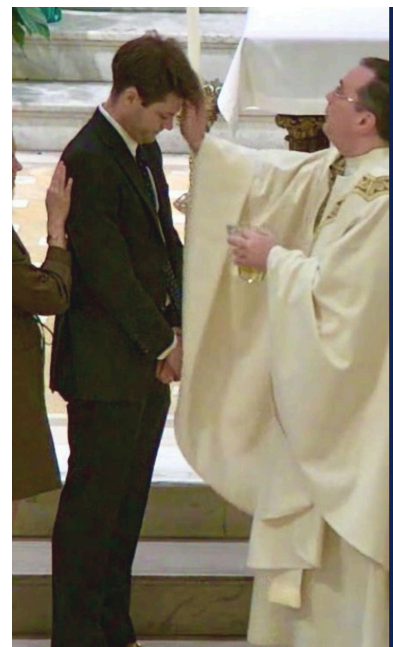

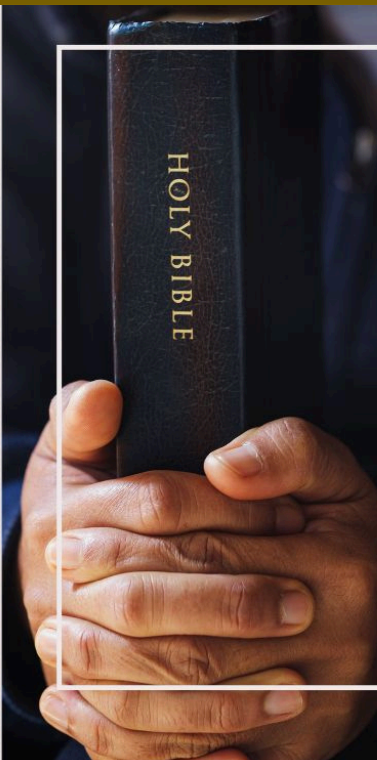
