Weekly Update from the Pastor

Offering the Precious Blood at Mass

As I noted on the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Jesus, I am grateful to all those who have served, continue to serve, and will serve as **Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion**. These volunteer ministers enable Jesus present in the Eucharist to be received, adored and lived prayerfully and peacefully at Mass or at home for those not able to be at Mass due to illness or mobility issues.

Whenever Extraordinary Ministers are available, we will make every effort to offer the Precious Blood of Jesus. Please remember that if you are not feeling well, or even have the slightest feeling of illness, please consider the health of those praying with you at Mass, and refrain from receiving the Precious Blood.

It was a particular blessing to see those praying with us at Mass reverently receiving Jesus' Body and Precious Blood this past weekend. For those who may not have been with us at Mass, please remember that as we are supposed to fast one hour before Mass. As such, no food or drink should be brought into Church. Those taking medicine requiring food, are exempt from fasting before receiving Holy Communion.

Maintaining a Safe Environment

Saint Augustine~Saint Francis Xavier makes every effort to comply with the Safe Environment mandates of the Diocese of Brooklyn which protect children, vulnerable adults, as well as all those who generously serve in the Church. For the safety of all, please be reminded that all children **need to be accompanied by a parent/guardian to the restrooms in Church**. As the locations of these restrooms are near exits, outside of the view of those at Mass, it is necessary for adults to ensure their child's safety.

Thank you to all those who assist us every day, in helping to keep children, vulnerable adults and all our volunteers and staff safe.

Some Maintenance Updates

Although last year, we were able to provide temporary air conditioning at **Saint Francis Xavier**, the temporary cost while considering a more permanent solution is not justifiable. Hopefully, a more efficient solution will be forthcoming. We anticipate beginning repairs to the collapsed drainage pipes around the Church and Parish Office in the near future, as well as the return of the gate to the parking area serving the Parish Office. Once that is complete, we anticipate finally making repairs to the roof above the baptistry area that caused some damage to the interior columns within the Sanctuary some years ago.

At **Saint Augustine**, replacing the roof on the chapel near the ramp entrance is almost complete. The tiles were replaced using original roof tiles that were kept for just this purpose. Sadly, we also just discovered that roots invaded the presumably 145-year-old original clay drainage pipes leading from Saint Augustine Rectory. Currently we await the process to remedy this concerning situation. In the same way, drainage pipes surrounding the Church and Rectory also still need to be repaired/replaced. Work on the ornamental fountain outside Saint Augustine, which was a 9/11 Remembrance, will commence to ensure it is working properly.

The large oak trees on 6th Avenue between Park Place and Sterling Place have long been a concern. An arborist provided a condition report which differed in some aspects from the one provided by the arborist for the Parks Department. For four years we've been promised that the Park's Department will be trimming trees; meanwhile, we continue to monitor the situation for the safety for all.

Happily, there is always something going on - never a dull moment.

GUIDELINES FOR HOLY COMMUNION

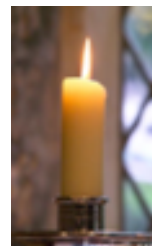

Catholic Christians who are able to receive should make a bow in reverence before receiving and answer the ministers' invitation of "The Body of Christ" with the clear answer "Amen". Our clear response of AMEN indicates that we say yes to Jesus in the Eucharist, and to God's plan for our salvation. For those unable to receive, including children who have not made their first Communion, at the end of Mass, at the final blessing, a blessing is imparted to all present in hopes that the unity of Jesus Christ will be realized.

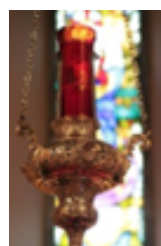

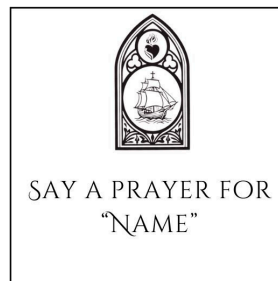

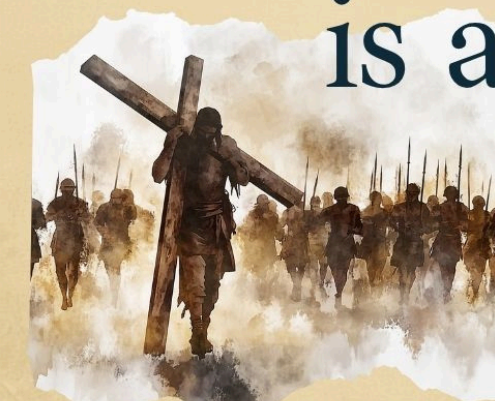
